Cintas and Matthew 25: Ministries share a longstanding partnership rooted in global impact. As Cintas' longest-running philanthropic ally, the international humanitarian aid and disaster relief organization has helped extend our reach and response around the world.

Since 1998, Cintas has proudly supported Matthew 25: Ministries in their mission to help people affected by hardship and disaster around the world. Through generous corporate and manufacturer donations, including contributions from Cintas, Matthew 25: Ministries reaches more than 30 million people globally each year.

Providing aid during disaster relief

Cintas consistently supports Matthew 25: Ministries and their disaster relief efforts so they have the equipment and tools ready for any disaster, whenever it may occur. This includes donating essential health and safety items, garments and any other tools that can help support others in a time of need. These





items are then carefully packaged by Matthew 25: Ministries into care boxes and delivered to disaster victims as they reach affected areas.

Cintas also sponsors a disaster response vehicle for Matthew 25: Ministries that distributes Cintas first aid and safety kits, which include essential supplies such as safety glasses, dust masks, latex gloves, wipes, and more, along with other basic necessities, to people affected by disasters. These supplies help ensure protection and safety for those working to clean up their homes or properties.

Other donations include eyeglasses and empty plastic pill bottles to help transport urgent medical supplies to affected areas.

Providing support through our Clothe the Kids campaign

Annually, Cintas employee-partners take part in a program called Clothe the Kids, where they donate new and gently used children's clothing and new school supplies to help Matthew 25: Ministries' efforts in aiding children all over the world.

This company-wide charitable campaign has been a favorite amongst employee-partners, as they have donated over four million items since the campaign's inception over 20 years ago. In FY25, employee-partners collected 142,648 items, equating to a Fair Market Value of approximately \$954,314.

Volunteer opportunities

Cintas employee-partners frequently volunteer at Matthew 25: Ministries' local processing center. They assist in sorting, processing and packing donated items that are then shipped globally to those in need.

With a wide range of fire protection services, the Cintas Fire Protection division is committed to supporting the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF) and their 9/11 Memorial Stair Climbs.

Fire-related emergencies can occur at any company at any time, regardless of location. That's why Cintas provides a wide range of services to help protect businesses and their employees both in prevention and during such emergencies.

Cintas' partnership with the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF) is a meaningful relationship as both organizations are dedicated to preventing and safeguarding individuals from fires and electrical hazards.

Since 2021, the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation has collaborated with Cintas' Fire Protection division on various national initiatives. Cintas actively supports the foundation's efforts to honor fallen firefighters and assist their families and colleagues.





Standing side by side for the 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb

Cintas is a chief sponsor of the 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb program, which honors the tragic events at the former World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.

This program extends across the United States every September and October, with thousands of Cintas employee-partners participating in the stair climbs. Our contributions from the 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb significantly impact the creation and maintenance of programs that directly support fire service survivors all across the country.

In FY25, Cintas hosted the NFFF 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb at TQL Stadium in Cincinnati, Ohio, and saw participation from nearly 1,400 people across the country. Cintas and its employee-partners helped raise more than \$157,588 to directly support families of fallen firefighters and support programs of the FDNY.

Beyond the Stair Climb, the Cintas Cares Foundation proudly backs key NFFF events shaping the future of fire safety, including:

- The High School Cadet Symposium in Detroit, Michigan—empowering leaders to build and grow Fire & EMS programs for youth.
- The Firefighter Life Safety Summit in St. Louis, Missouri—celebrating 20 years of the 16 Life Safety Initiatives and driving new progress.
- The U.S. Fire Administrator's Summit in Emmitsburg, Maryland—connecting top fire service leaders and federal decision-makers.

Together, we're building safer communities and stronger leadership nationwide.

The Cintas Partner Assistance Fund (CPAF) is always here when our partners need it most, and FY25 was yet another powerful reminder of its importance.

At Cintas, we believe in taking care of our partners, especially during times of unexpected hardship. That's why the Cintas Partner Assistance Fund (CPAF), a program of the Cintas Cares Foundation, was established in 2019 to provide financial support to partners impacted by natural disasters.

The fund has been able to extend its coverage to include personal disasters and hardships like a house fire, the loss of a spouse or dependent, domestic abuse and more. Since expanding, it has been able to support more of our employee-partners this past year.

In FY25, the fund provided approximately \$1 million in relief, compared to \$233,798 in FY24. This drastic increase shows just how important these funds are and how Cintas was able to support over 700 employee-partners as they navigated these situations.



Supporting our partners in the wake of Hurricane Helene

This year was a powerful reminder of the importance of CPAF in the wake of many natural disasters including Hurricane Helene's devastation.

Late in September 2024, Hurricane Helene made landfall and caused devastation to many people and their communities across the eastern part of the country, including Asheville, North Carolina. This hurricane impacted several of our locations and our partners who live there.

Fortunately, the Cintas Partner Assistance fund was there to help. Over 150 partners who were impacted by the hurricane applied for aid, and over \$180,000 was granted in assistance.

These funds assisted our partners in many ways. From flood damage to fallen trees and house repairs, the fund was there when they needed it most.

Many of our employee-partners have felt the impact of cancer, whether personally or through a loved one. That's why we're committed to making a difference: by supporting cancer patients, uplifting their families and working with the American Cancer Society so we can have a future without cancer.

Cintas supports the American Cancer Society through various fundraising programs,

including Relay for Life, Making Strides
Against Breast Cancer, the Cincinnati Golf
Classic, the Cintas Apparel Sale and more.
In FY25, Cintas provided more than \$111,000
in direct support to the ACS through these
programs, a 4.7% increase over the past year.
Additionally, our U.S.-based locations have
helped raise nearly \$1,400,000 for the ACS
through grassroots, community-based efforts
since 1984.

We support the American Cancer Society's mission to improve the lives of people with cancer. In turn, many of our employee-partners impacted by cancer have been supported by the American Cancer Society's programs. This includes services such as their Road to Recovery program, which provides transportation to and from treatment for cancer patients who don't have a ride or cannot drive themselves.

Other services available to Cintas employeepartners include the ACS 24/7 live online patient support, live cancer prevention webinars with medical experts, and access to more than 30 free Hope Lodge communities for patients and caregivers who must travel out of town for treatment.

"When my father passed away in 2018, I went to Guatemala to make arrangements and oversee his estate. While I was there, I felt sick and went to the doctor. They did several tests, but there wasn't anything conclusive, and he referred me for further testing. Once I was back in the U.S., I went through a series of other tests, including an ultrasound, an MRI and a mammogram. The doctor said he saw something, but I wasn't given an official diagnosis yet. I went to get a second opinion, and it was there that I was given the news that I had breast cancer. The doctor recommended a mastectomy of my right breast. My husband and I decided this was the best course of action. I remember how hard it was; I was still grieving the death of my father, and I kept thinking, 'I'm sick, I've got cancer.' It was a rough year, and I was very scared at times because you don't know what will happen.

But in 2021, after a few years of treatment, I was given the all clear, that I was cancer free! We were so happy and so relieved. I was thankful because I know a lot of people don't make it.

That's why I believe it's important that Cintas supports organizations like the American Cancer Society, because there are a lot of partners that can be helped by our participation. October 2024 was my first time participating in the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer walk in Atlanta. I was very happy to see so many people participating. Our Cintas location raised \$1,200 for the event, and I was very proud of that. Not only did we raise money, but we spread awareness too. I plan on participating again this year."

For nearly two decades, Cintas has worked side by side with the American Heart Association (AHA) to promote heart health, training and lifesaving education to the communities we serve.

Through this strong and collaborative relationship, Cintas has become the largest national provider of AHA cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external

defibrillator (AED) training, and we are proud to be a supporter in all of their efforts, including the Heart Mini Marathon & Walk.





Training in action

Cintas, as the largest training center for the American Heart Association in the U.S., provides businesses with extensive training and certification in first aid, CPR and AEDs.

Through our AED and CPR training, Cintas equips businesses with essential life-saving skills through comprehensive certification programs. With a nationwide network of over 200 certified AHA instructors, we deliver critical training to more than 25,000 companies and their employees each year.

A record-breaking Heart Mini Marathon & Walk campaign

Each year, Cintas proudly participates in the American Heart Association's National Heart Walks, bringing our locations from across the country together to support heart health.
